

HEAD COACH'S EXPECTATIONS

This is not intended to be a contract. Its purpose is to let coaches know the commitment expected as a Head Coach.

As a Head Coach you are expected, at a minimum, to:

- 1. Promote the growth of all team members with respect to soccer techniques, tactics, and fitness.
- 2. Conduct training sessions (practices, scrimmages, games, or any combination of these) with an appropriate frequency. At a minimum:
 - a. During the outdoor pre-season (approx. April to May), on average 3 times per week.
 - b. During outdoor season (approx May to July), practice on average twice per week
 - c. During the indoor season, as scheduled by the Club (1 to 1½ hours per week from approximately November to April).
- Pre-plan practices and have written practice plans for practices. Use the training approach as defined by NYSW: the teaching of skills/tactics should be sequential and age appropriate; touches on the ball and fun should be main ingredients of all practice sessions.
- 4. Attend all scheduled league and tournament games.
- 5. The Fairport Soccer Club team must be your primary Head Coaching responsibility (i.e. you may be an Assistant Coach for another club, but not a Head Coach).
- Attend the following meetings: FSC Coaches' Meeting (approx 2 hours in November), FSC Annual Meeting (approx 1 ½ hours during or near November), and League's Schedule Distribution Meeting (2 hours, in March).

- 7. Work with other clubs' coaches prior to the start of the outdoor season to modify the game schedule to accommodate conflicts, if necessary.
- 8. Hold an initial parent meeting prior to the outdoor season to promote open communication and maintain open dialog with the parents.
- 9. Develop a season plan.
- 10. Possess or obtain the "E" license during the first year as a head coach.
- 11. Possess or obtain the "D" license as a head coach for teams ages 14 and over.
- 12. Help select your team's assistant Coach(es) and Manager.
- 13. Make efforts to expand knowledge and experience through vehicles such as clinics and coaching roundtable sessions.
- 14. Assist with Fairport Soccer Club tryouts (two weekends in September).
- 15. Provide the Girls or Boys Directors with written evaluations of each team member by the end of the outdoor season (July).
- 16. Return team equipment to the FSC at the end of season.
- 17. Conduct yourself in a manner that reflects positively on Fairport Soccer Club's good reputation.
- 18. Reach out to FSC SD for any questions / concerns / practice plan support / advice / etc.

If the Head Coach is unable to attend a practice, scrimmage, game, etc. he/she will arrange for the Assistant Coach or an appropriate alternate to manage the activity.
